MOTION BY GARCIA TO DENY THE APPEAL AND APPROVE THE PROJECT AND CERTIFY THE ADDENDUM TO EIR NO. 99081140 AND ADOPT REVISED MITIGATION, MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRAM AND STATEMENT OF OVERRIDING CONSIDERATIONS, WITH THE ADDITION OF THE FOLLOWING CONDITION: "THAT WITHIN 90 DAYS OF ENROLLMENT AT 841, 1,500 AND 2,000 STUDENTS, THE ROCK ACADEMY AND CHURCH SHALL SUBMIT TO THE CITY MANAGER A TRANSPORTATION STUDY MEASURING SCHOOL AND CHURCH GENERATED AVERAGE DAILY TRAFFIC AND PEAK HOUR TRAFFIC, AND SHALL ALSO SUBMIT A TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT PLAN IDENTIFYING ALTERNATIVE MEASURES TO ENSURE THAT THE PROJECT ADHERES TO THE 4,020 TRIP ADT CAP FOR THE PROJECT."
